Junior Poultry Rules St. Francois County Fair Superintendent – Amber Wampler

RULES

- 1. General Livestock Rules and Regulations and Youth General Rules and Regulations apply in this department.
- 2. Poultry will be judged according to the American Standard of Perfection as authorized by the American Poultry Association.
- 3. All exhibited animals must be free of any visible signs of infection, contagious disease or parasites. Exhibitors may be asked to remove any animal not in good health. Dismissal will be at the discretion of the superintendent or judge.
- 4. The American Poultry Association Standard of Perfection does not allow for enhancements to a bird's natural (how it was hatched) appearance (for example, coloring or dying of feathers, legs, earlobes, etc.).
- 5. Showmanship: Showmanship will be open to all 4-H and FFA poultry exhibitors. Exhibitors choosing to participate are not required to be signed up ahead of time. There will be three divisions: Novice 1st year exhibitor of any age; Junior Ages 8-14; Senior Ages 15-21. Exhibitors must show their own animal. The judge will place the top 3 exhibitors in each of the showmanship classes. Results will be announced at the conclusion of the show and recipients will receive awards at the awards ceremony. The decision of the showmanship judge is final. There will be no interference, and no one is allowed in the ring.
- 6. Sale of Champions: Exhibitors interested in selling any bird entered in the fair at the auction **must notify the superintendent at check-in**. All auction animals must be an exhibit at the current fair. Auction sign up will close TBD. Exhibitors are not required to join the St. Francois County Boiler Project in order to show and sell broilers/roasters at the fair. Exhibitors must attend the majority (50% + 1) of meetings or events hosted by the 4-H Club they are affiliated with to be eligible to sell.

Pullorum-Typhoid Testing (P/T testing)

- 1. All poultry must be P/T tested within 90 days prior to fair. All poultry need to be lice free. Go to https://agriculture.mo.gov/animals/health/disease/poultry.php for more information.
- 2. The Missouri Department of Agriculture will provide a state animal health officer to conduct P/T testing and conduct a general health inspection during check in at the fairgrounds. Date to be determined.

Before Fair

- 1. 4-H and FFA exhibitors are required to fulfill work hours that are mandated by the St. Francois County Fair Board in order to participate in the fair. Dates and times will be announced several weeks in advance of the fair.
 - a. The poultry/rabbit barn requires maintenance during the fair work days. It is encouraged that exhibitors competing with poultry participate in setting up pens, cleaning feeders, cleaning and replacing shavings, etc.

- 2. Wire and ground cages are available in the fair poultry/rabbit barn, but each exhibitor must indicate on Fair Entry how many are needed. Exhibitors mark ground pens for large poultry and waterfowl. All poultry listed in the poultry show will need a cage and stay on the fairgrounds.
- 3. 4-H and FFA exhibitors may show poultry in the open class, however the same poultry cannot be shown in both the open and junior class.
- 4. It's the exhibitor's responsibility to appropriately classify their poultry and place them in the correct class. You may reference The American Poultry Association for assistance.
- 5. Exhibitors need to bring their own supply box or can use an empty cage after check-in, if available, for feed or storage supplies.
- 6. Feeders and waterers are provided; however, exhibitors may utilize their own equipment if they wish.
- 7. Refer to the classification list of poultry for assistance.

Exhibiting Poultry at Fair

- 1. Provide ample feed & water. Secure the containers to keep them upright.
- 2. Fans are welcome in hot weather. Use frozen water bottles in cages to keep poultry cool, if needed.
- 3. Keep your stalling area neat and clean. Clean dirty wood chips out from under your cages before adding new chips.
- 4. Cage decorations shall not extend farther than 18 inches below the bottom of the cage.

Fair Check-in

- 1. A veterinarian or state animal health officer will inspect each bird. Exhibitors need to be present during this process. If the exhibitor is unable to be present, make sure to check with the superintendent or MU Extension staff. No poultry allowed in cages without prior inspection.
- 2. All poultry must be on the grounds by 6PM in the poultry/rabbit barn.
 - a. Superintendent will check P/T certifications and verify poultry classes entered.
 - b. Cages will be marked with your name in the poultry/rabbit barn on cards provided by the superintendent.
 - c. Extra cages will be allowed to exhibitors if space allows. NO refunds will be issued.

Fair Show Day

- 1. The poultry superintendent will keep exhibitors informed of the show order. However, it is the responsibility of the project member to stay alert and pay attention to announcements. Exhibitors must be standing by their poultries cage and follow the judge's instructions when the class is called.
- 2. Any class with less than 3 entries may be combined with similar classes.
- 3. All poultry must be at the poultry/rabbit barn at the beginning of the show.
- 4. Members must exhibit their own poultry but can have another member/family member help if a couple of classes are combined due to low numbers.

5. Birds must be deserving of a blue ribbon to be eligible to receive a ribbon, this can be up to the judge's or superintendent's decision.

Load out

- 1. No poultry may be removed from the fairgrounds, except by order of the superintendent.
- 2. All poultry, except broilers and roasters, will remain on the fairgrounds until Saturday 9PM and must be removed by 12PM Sunday.
- 3. There will be a mandatory work day to help clean up the fairgrounds. Exhibitors are encouraged to participate in cleaning the poultry/rabbit barn and breaking down cages for storage.

Use the list of breed classes provided here to help you identify your poultry on Fair Entry. Not all breeds may be identified on the lists.
